# Supervised practice in 2013 for Nuclear Medicine Scientists/Technologists

### **Purpose**

This document provides information on the process of undertaking supervised practice in 2013. It is intended for use by students and recent graduates from programs of study where a period of supervised practice is required. The appendix provides contact details for key organisations that are up to date at time of publication.

#### Why the Medical Radiation Practice Board is publishing this information

The Medical Radiation Practice Board of Australia (the Board) has recently reached agreement with the professional association Australian & New Zealand Society of Nuclear Medicine (ANZSNM) to administer supervised practice for nuclear medicine scientists/technologists in 2013. With the end of the academic year approaching, graduating students and employers need information on the process for supervised practice in 2013.

#### Registration and radiation licensing

The Health Practitioner Regulation National Law as in force in each state and territory (the National Law) requires those practicing as medical radiation practitioners to be registered with the Board.

For students and recent graduates from certain programs of study there is a further requirement to participate in a supervised practice program that has been approved by the Board.

A separate requirement of each Australian state and territory is that practitioners must be licensed to use radiation (please note that this license is not issued or required by the Board).

## **Supervised practice program**

The supervised practice program approved by the Board for nuclear medicine scientists/technologists for 2013 is the Professional Development Year, PDY, run by the Australian & New Zealand Society of Nuclear Medicine (ANZSNM).

#### Amendments to the current supervised practice programs

The Board and ANZSNM have agreed to amendments to the supervised practice program:

- a) The ANZSNM will administer supervised practice for nuclear medicine technologists through the ANZSNM PDY program for 2013.
- b) The proportion of registered practitioners to supervised practitioners will be at a ratio of 1:1, subject to contingency plans for sole practitioner sites.
- c) There will be no cost to practitioners to participate in the program.
- d) There will be no cost to accredit practices to take PDY participants for 2013.

#### **Typical Process**

The following steps outline the typical process for graduating students to become registered.

• Apply for Provisional registration with the Board by completing a *Provisional* registration form ASPR 91 or by registering online through the AHPRA website (www.ahpra.gov.au) Step • Contact ANZSNM to register with its supervised practice program Step Apply for radiation use licence with the respective state or territory government department (see contacts list below) Step 3 You may commence practice when: · you are registered with the Board, and · you hold a radiation use license, and Step 4 • you are participating in a Board appro∨ed supervised practice program.

## Applying for registration with the Board

If you are an Australian or New Zealand graduate from a three year course, you are required to undertake a period of supervised practice in order to practice. You can apply for registration via the *Graduate* applications section on the AHPRA website www.ahpra.gov.au/

You can also register by using the ASPR 91 Application form which can be downloaded from the Board's website, under the Registrations > Forms tab.

For the purposes of meeting the qualification requirement defined in the National Law, the Board will only accept an official academic transcript from the university through which you undertook the approved program of study or a letter of completion signed by an approved signatory of the University.

## **Employment and registering**

Graduate practitioners are encouraged to apply for registration, even if they have not yet secured a supervised practice position. This will enable practitioners to apply for their radiation license with the relevant State or Territory licensing authority. Once a registered practitioner has secured employment and has commenced supervised practice, they must notify the Board of their principal place of practice and their supervisor's details.

#### **Questions and Answers**

## Supervised practice in 2013 for Nuclear medicine scientists/technologists

#### 1. What is Provisional Registration?

Provisional registration is for medical radiation practice graduates from three year courses. It is used where the applicant has never practiced the profession and the National Board indicates that graduates must undertake a period of supervised practice in order to meet the requirements of general registration.

## 2. Where can I get an application for Provisional registration?

**Application forms** can be downloaded from the Board's website, under the *Registration > Forms* tab.

#### 3. Where can I get more information about supervised practice?

For 2013 supervised practice for nuclear medicine scientists/technologists will be administered by Australian & New Zealand Society for Nuclear Medicine (ANZSNM)

#### 4. How do I get a supervised practice position?

The decision regarding a particular position is not one made by the Medical Radiation Practice Board of Australia. It is a decision for each individual employer to consider whether they create or maintain a particular training position.

### 5. When can I start a supervised practice position?

In order to practice as a medical radiation practitioner you must be registered with the Board. Each state and territory also has requirements relating to radiation licensing. Additionally as a Provisional Registrant, you will need to participate in a supervised practice program approved by the Board. If you do not meet the above criteria you may be practicing in breach of the law.

### 6. What happens if I practice unregistered or unlicensed?

If you practice without being registered with the Board or you practice without a radiation license you may be in breach of the law.

It is a serious matter to practice unregistered or unlicensed. In these circumstances the Board may consider the breach as a *prima facie* case of professional misconduct.

## 7. What happens if I am not part of an approved supervised practice program?

If you are not listed with the ANZSNM to participate in its supervised practice program for nuclear medicine scientists/technologists, any time you have already worked will not count towards the completion of your supervised practice requirements.

If you practice for an extended period of time without participating in an approved supervised practice program, you will be practicing in breach of your registration with the Board.

In these circumstances the Board may treat that breach as professional conduct matter.
