- approve accreditation standards and accredited courses of study.

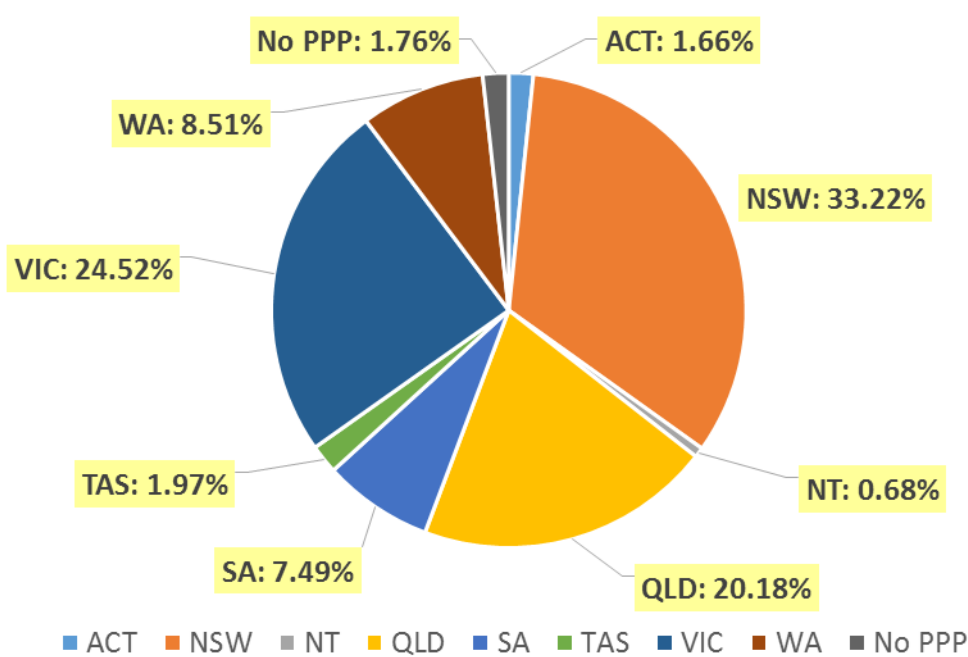

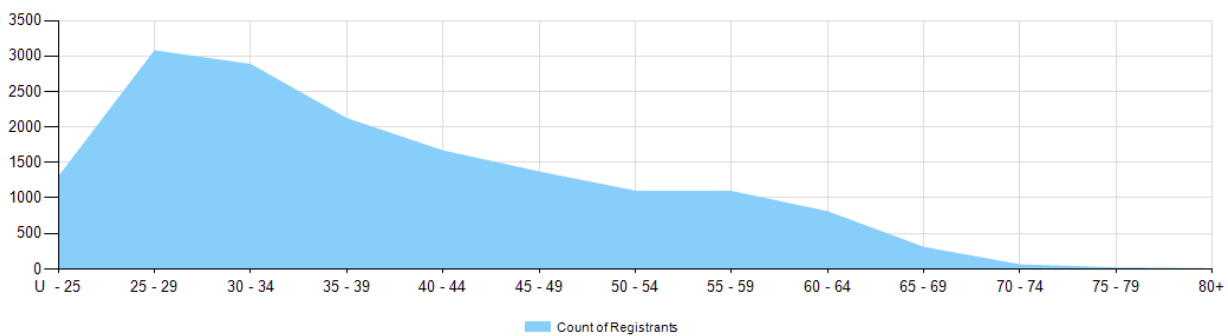
